NJAC President and Warren County Freeholder Deputy Director Richard D. Gardner announced that Salem County Freeholder Beth Timberman could not attend today's meeting due to some health concerns. NJAC President Gardner thanked Immediate Past President Timberman for her leadership during her presidency of NJAC. He also thanked members for the opportunity to lead the board and looks forward to working with everyone in 2012.

The minutes of the December 2, 2011 Board Meeting were unanimously approved on a County Surrogate/County Clerk motion.

1. **NJAC Nominating Committee Report -** Stephen O'Connor, Chair of the Nominating Committee and Cape May County Administrator, presented the 2012 slate of executive officers. Mr. O'Connor noted that M. Claire French serves on the Nominating Committee and abstained from the vote when the committee met (via conference call) in November 2011. On a County Surrogate motion, seconded by Middlesex County, and carried by voice vote, the 2012 Slate of Executive Officers was unanimously approved.

2. **Secretary/Treasurer's Report -** NJAC Secretary-Treasurer and Union County Freeholder Angel Estrada asked John Donnadio, NJAC Executive Director, to present the financial reports of NJAC and NJAC Benefits to the board members. On a Mercer County motion, seconded by County Sheriff, and carried by voice vote, the financial reports were unanimously approved.

- 3. **President's Report -** NJAC President Gardner asked for motions on the following:
 - a. <u>Resolution 2012 Annual Dues</u> NJAC Executive Director John G. Donnadio informed the board members that this is the third consecutive year that county membership annual dues were not being raised year. On a Union County motion, seconded by County Clerk, and carried by voice vote, the 2012 Annual Dues Resolution was unanimously approved.
 - b. Resolution 2011 Budget On a County Surrogate motion, seconded by Middlesex County, and carried by voice vote, the 2012 Budget was unanimously approved.
 - c. <u>Resolution NJAC Committees and Chairs</u> Mr. Donnadio notified the board of the 2012 Committees and Chairs. They are as follows:

- d. <u>Resolution NJAC Legal Counsel</u> On a Mercer County motion, seconded by Monmouth County, and carried by voice vote, the 2012 Legal Counsel was unanimously approved.
- e. <u>Resolution Labor Relations Counsel</u> On a County Surrogate motion, seconded by a Union County motion, and carried by voice vote, the 2012 Labor Counsel was unanimously approved.
- f. <u>Resolution Accountant/Auditor</u> On a County Executive motion, seconded by a Hudson County motion, and carried by voice vote, the 2012 Labor Counsel was unanimously approved.
- g. Resolution NJAC 2012 Board of Directors' Meeting Schedule On a County Surrogate motion, seconded by Middlesex County motion, and carried by voice vote this resolution was unanimously approved.
- h. Resolution National County Government Month (April 2012) The National Association of Counties (NACo) has set National County Government for April. NACo has yet to forward the resolution onto the State Associations. For now, this order of business is tabled and will be discussed for approval at the March 16th, 2012 Board of Directors' Meeting.

4. **Executive Director's Report -** NJAC Executive Director John G. Donnadio thanked Freeholder Timberman for her leadership as President, support and dedication to NJAC.

Mr. Donnadio thanked all those who attended and supported the December 2nd, 2011 Summit on Police Consolidation.

Objectives and goals for NJAC in 2012 were mentioned:

- a. Legislation priorities;
- b. New hire of a Legislative Director;
- c. Hold workshops with 75% 80% CEU's at the NJAC Annual Conference;
- d. Have the County Finance Officers, Purchasing Officials, Planners, and Administrators hold their meetings at the NJAC Annual Conference.
- 5. **Legislative Committee Report -** Hudson County Freeholder Jeffrey Dublin informed all Board members that a copy of the Legislative Update was enclosed in the provided packets and turned this portion of the meeting over to Mr. Donnadio.

Mr. Donnadio informed board members that legislative sessions had resumed. New matter of discussion is the county operated nursing homes. Medicaid rate reductions imposed by the Department of Health and Senior Services hit county governments disproportionately hard. County operated nursing homes stand to lose approximately \$13,444,823.00 in Medicaid reimbursement revenue with no practical means to make up the difference.

NJAC has several meetings scheduled with legislative leaders over the next several weeks to discuss developing a solution that will allow county governments to continue providing a high standard of care to a vulnerable population.

Other Business:

Hudson County Surrogate De Leo complimented the NJAC staff on the distribution and concise content of the State House News. The State House News is an update on legislation emailed biweekly to county officials.

Mr. Donnadio is meeting with Acting DCA Commissioner Richard E. Constable III on February 13th in Trenton. The purpose of the meeting regards streamlining the refunding bond process. Board members and administrators were invited to attend the meeting.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 16, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. in Committee Room 4 of the NJ State House Annex.

This meeting was adjourned at 10:44 a.m. on a Hudson/Warren County motion.

Board members and guests reassembled at 11:00 a.m. in the Senate Chambers for the Swearing-In Ceremony of NJAC President Gardner and Executive Officers. Former New Jersey State Governor Donald T. DiFrancesco administered the Oath of Office. NJAC President Gardner and Executive Committee members were congratulated by Former NJ State Governor

DiFrancesco. NJAC President Gardner thanked everyone for their support and is looking forward to leading NJAC in 2012.

On behalf of the NJAC Board of Directors, NJAC President Gardner presented a plaque for Freeholder Timberman for her leadership in 2011. Salem County Clerk of the Board, Earl Gage, accepted the award in her absence. NJAC President Gardner also recognized county officials, dignitaries and honored guests in the audience. Guests were invited to Room 109 for a reception catered by the culinary students of Warren County Technical School.

The ceremony ended at 11:40a.m.
