NJAC President Simmons reviewed the following resolutions for professional appointments, which were passed as general consent matters on a Mercer/Cape May County vote:

NJAC President Simmons recognized special guests and thanked her family, friends and those in attendance for being so supportive. Additionally, President Simmons reminded members of the audience that NJAC has accomplished a great deal on behalf of counties and continues to do so. Much effort has been made with regard to the Transportation Trust Fund, the 2% property tax cap, pension and health benefits, interest arbitration, bail reform, and electronic funding transfers.

3. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT - NJAC Executive Director John G. Donnadio thanked Freeholder King for his tremendous leadership and support to NJAC as President in 2016 and presented him with an award.

Somerset County Freeholder Director Peter S. Palmer was given an honorable mention. 2017 marks his last year as a freeholder since he will not participate in this year's election. He began his career as freeholder in 1997 with Somerset County. Honorable Palmer has been a NJAC Board of Director since 2000 and served as NJAC President in 2010. Starting on May 11, 2017 NJAC will present a business associate with the newly named Peter S. Palmer Business Associate of the Year Award.

Mr. Donnadio thanked those who attended and supported the December 9, 2016 Summit on Pension and Health Benefits. Over 200 county and business leaders from across the State attended the event. This was a successful one day event in which Ford M. Scudder, NJ State Treasurer, served as the keynote speaker.

Mr. Donnadio informed members and guests that the NJAC Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization affiliated with the New Jersey Association of Counties. It is committed to providing innovative educational opportunities for county vocational-technical school and county college students of New Jersey. The Foundation has partnered with business leaders such as Investors Bank, PSEG, NJM Insurance Group, Wells Fargo, and Verizon. Through the generosity of these prominent companies, the Foundation has had the opportunity to provide some much needed financial assistance to an impressive group of hardworking students. During the past five years, NJAC Foundation has donated more than \$205,500.00 in scholarships to over 375 county vocational-technical school graduates.

NJAC's Conference Committee met on January 20th to discuss this year's 67th annual celebration of county government scheduled to take place from May 10th through May 12th at Caesar's in Atlantic City. This year's event includes the 6th annual county vocational-technical school cook-off challenge, acapella performances by county college students, a reporters' roundtable discussion, 24 accredited workshops, speaking engagements by the 2017 Gubernatorial Candidate, and of course, the opportunity to network with county and business leaders from across the State.

Judy Savage, Executive Director for the NJ Council of County Vocational-Technical Schools, discussed the rules and selection process of the 2017 cook-off challenge. Automatic entries for 2017 include: Gloucester County as the County of the 2017 NJAC President and Cumberland County as the as the 2016 People's Choice Gold Award. Schools from Bergen, Camden Essex, Mercer, Middlesex, Morris and Passaic Counties are automatic entries since they did not participate last year and met the required application deadline. Hudson and Monmouth Counties were selected from a drawing to compete for the remaining two slots. Atlantic, Burlington, Somerset, Union and Warren Counties participated in last year's competition and also applied to compete this year.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 10, 2017 at 9:30 a.m. in Committee Room 4 of the NJ State House Annex.
